

Thomas (Tom) Emmett Malloy

Tom Malloy has established himself as an extraordinary businessman and entrepreneur. In 1973 he established Trench Shoring Company, which has become a successful leader in providing special shoring equipment, and trench crossing plates for rental to the construction industry with nine branches in Southern California and one in Las Vegas, Nevada.

He has also extended his talents to the metals fabrication industry. He currently holds a position as Chairman of the Republic Bank, Inc. an industrial leasing company, of Bountiful, Utah.

Tom graduated from Loyola High School in 1957 and went on to earn his Bachelor of Science degree in Finance from the University of San Francisco School of Business in 1961. Since that time he has been an ardent supporter of the University and was honored with an appointment to the Board of Trustees in June 1996 and concluded four years as Chairman at end of June 2015. In October 2004, Tom and his wife Sharon were honored when the new Business School was dedicated in their name, 'Malloy Hall'. He was selected as The 2005 Beta Gamma Sigma Chapter Honoree of the University of San Francisco School of Business and Management.

Tom also 'gives back' by being a community leader on numerous Committees and Boards such as serving on the boards of the Los Angeles Chapter of the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation from 1989-1996, Chairing 1990-1992; the Little Company of Mary Hospital Foundation Board, Torrance, CA from 1989-1994; the Rebuild Los Angeles Construction Task Force from 1992-1993; the Associated General Contractors of California, Los Angeles District from 1986-2001; the Southern California Contractors Association from 1973-2001; and the Engineering Contractors Association from 1978-1993.

Currently Tom is a Member of Board of Governors at Chapman University, and a Member of Board of Regents Physical Resources Committee at Loyola High School in Los Angeles.

Tom has set a personal goal, "... to extend the principles of a proper life into my business life." As examples of his success toward this goal he has been honored to be the recipient of; the Medallion of St. Ignatius of Loyola from Loyola High School in Los Angeles; the 2009 Cahalan Award at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, CA; in 2009 dedication of the 'Malloy Commons' at Loyola High School; the 1999 Community Achievement Award from Switzer Center, Torrance, CA; and the 1995 and the 2012 D.I.G. Award from the Engineering Contractors Association, an award presented to Members who has demonstrated the qualities of Dignity, Integrity and Generosity to his profession and community.

On the personal side, Tom Malloy was introduced to racing at a young age by his Dad – Emmett J. Malloy – who owned two open-wheel race cars and built/owned Carrell Speedway in Gardena, California. Because of his passion to preserve the history of American auto racing, he has built an unique private collection of cars and racing memorabilia. He has been lucky enough to have shown and raced his cars all over the United States and even foreign countries such as England, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and France.

Tom and Sharon have been married since August of 1960. They have four children; Bridgett, Kevin, Kelley, and Ryan; and ten grandchildren.
